What happens to your paper and card

Your paper and card is sorted and graded at a facility in Greater Manchester. It is then baled and transported to reprocessors for recycling back into new products, such as books or magazines.

Putting the wrong things in your blue paper and card bin lowers the quality and value of the recycling. This can cause a lorry load of paper and card to be rejected and not recycled, which costs Salford council money.
